Charter and Purpose (*)

Overview

The Queensland Futures Institute (QFI) has established the Queensland Health Futures Council, a collaborative, future-focused forum bringing together private and public health organisations to support innovation in policy, research, and investment attraction in Queensland's healthcare system.

Purpose

- 1. Unite leaders from Queensland's public and private health sectors in a collaborative, future-focused forum.
- 2. Drive innovation in health policy, research, and service delivery to meet Queensland's evolving healthcare needs.
- 3. Attract and facilitate strategic investment in Queensland's healthcare system, medical research, and life sciences industries.
- 4. Foster collaboration between government, industry, and academia to accelerate innovation in health and medical technologies.
- 5. Identify and champion opportunities that position Queensland as a leader in health research and innovation.
- 6. Strengthen healthcare across regional, rural, and remote communities through targeted innovation and investment.
- 7. Provide a trusted platform for shaping the future of healthcare in Queensland through insight, influence, and action.

Administration

- The **Council** is a decision-making body, with representation being CEO (or equivalent)
- An action-focused **Taskforce** implements Council decisions. Representation is typically a corporate/external affairs executive with intra-organisational reach.
- Two Council meetings are to be held annually.
- Taskforce meetings are to be held approximately quarterly to drive Council initiatives.
- An Annual Health Futures event.



- Being auspiced by the QFI, administrative and coordination support will be included within the QFI's membership fee, noting that QFI membership is a prerequisite for Council participation.
