OVERVIEW

The Queensland Futures Summit concentrated on discussing issues from the five 'Futures Themes' adopted by the Queensland Futures Institute:

- Queensland as a Global Hub for Education and Research;
- Taking Advantage of Emerging Technologies;
- Creating Thriving Regions;
- · Valuing our World Class Asset the Great Barrier Reef; and
- Growing and Benefiting from the Asian Century.

The salient theme from the day was promoting a sustainable Queensland economy through education, innovation, entrepreneurship and tourism, in addition to the traditional reliance on the State's natural resource endowment. Discussions focused on a range topics from the need for greater collaboration between industry and universities to drive the establishment and development of future innovation to enhancing our connection to and economic benefit derived from our connection with Asia.

Specific discussion explored the need for quality teaching in Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) areas to support the development of innovation and entrepreneurship within school leavers; the need to promote and communicate the health of our natural resource areas such as the Great Barrier Reef, including its role in tourism; the importance of connectivity and digital infrastructure with rural Queensland; and promoting partnerships between universities and business.


Members of the Queensland Futures Institute are now considering the Full Report on the Futures Summit, aiming to initiate priority projects to lift Queensland's economic and social growth.
